Critical Repair Success Stories

Meet the Critchlow Family





Ms. Critchlow, a single mother of four, became a homeowner in 2018 in Essex County. While balancing her job as a secretary and studying for her social work degree, she noticed roof water damage. At a local event, she connected with Habitat of Greater Newark's Outreach Coordinator, Cassandra Dock who referred her to our Critical Repair Program. HFHGN was able to repair Ms. Critchlow's roof, making it possible for her to remain safe in the place she calls home.



Robyn Webb, a dedicated US Postal Service employee of 18 years was forced into early retirement due to an injury that caused a permanent disability. After retirement, living on a fixed income, Robyn struggled to support her family and disabled son. When her roof fell into disrepair causing leakage, creating mold issues, and damaging sheetrock throughout her home, she felt as though she had nowhere to turn, until she found Habitat for Humanity for Humanity of Greater Newark. Habitat Greater Newark is proud to say that we were able to repair Robyn's home and provide her with the security and comfort she is so deserving of.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY OF GREATER NEWARK HAPPENINGS West & Central Village Community Resource Hub

Over the past year, HFHGN's West and Central Village Community Resource Hub has become a beacon of hope for residents in the Greater Newark area, evolving into a comprehensive center focused on health, nutrition, and overall well-being. With generous funding from The Healthcare Foundation of New Jersey (HFNJ), we have expanded our outreach to address the critical needs of the community. A key initiative has been the addition of fresh produce to our pantry, made possible through a partnership with the Greater Newark Conservancy. Weekly donations of seasonal fruits and vegetables have boosted morale and promoted healthier eating habits among our patrons. This year, we aim to double last year's impact of serving 49,000 meals to 700 families. In partnership with food agencies and mental health organizations, we will address food insecurity, expand available resources, and enhance our programming, which includes health and wellness, financial literacy, and mental health services.

Additionally, our West and Central Village Community Resource Hub houses a computer lab for resume building, virtual meetings, and schoolwork, benefiting over 180 individuals in 2024. Our ID Restoration Program, in partnership with Franciscan Charities, has issued over 3,000 IDs since inception, helping residents access documentation for seeking employment or the chance to change their lives by entering rehab.

Health and Wellness

HFHGN's health and wellness drives community impact by fostering changes in behavior, environments, and practices, empowering individuals to live fulfilling lives and contribute to broader economic and social growth.

Victim & Trauma Awareness

HFHGN's Victim and Trauma Awareness Events aim to educate individuals about trauma, stabilize trauma-related symptoms like PTSD, and address how trauma impacts daily life. Trauma can result from natural disasters, accidents, and violence, affecting people of all ages. Our goal is to promote healing and recovery through trauma-informed support.







2025 HFHGN Health and Wellness Events

This year, Habitat Greater Newark will host Health and Wellness Events focused on women's and men's health, community trauma, and youth engagement, along with two community distribution days. In May, the Spring Women's Wellness Fair will welcome back the University Hospital Mammogram Van, and wellness classes with

Yaquanna Williams and ImSoYoga. In July, we will host the 2nd Annual Victim & Trauma Awareness Event, connecting resources and screening vehicles with University Hospital and referrals to rehabilitation programs. August will bring the Youth Wellness Block Party, in partnership with Brothers Building a Better Nation, offering healthy meals, free haircuts, school supplies, boxing, and wellness vendors. Through our West and Central Village Community Resource Hub's food pantry, we will expand nutrition education and wellness workshops, increase food donations, and continue monthly blood and glucose screenings with University Hospital. Additionally, we will resume Community Conditions Panel meetings, host a tax informational session with the IRS, and provide ongoing support through resource vendors at HFHGN's West and Central Village Community Resource Hub.
